<b>RE-LAY WETPOUR SURFACE AT OWL PLAY AREA</b> The wetpour surfacing around the play equipment has been identified as a trip hazard risk by the annual inspection conducted on behalf of the parish council. Contractors have visited the play area and advised that any patch repair would be a temporary measure and that a complete relay was required. This scheme would deliver a new wet pour surface around the play equipment that completely replaces the existing wetpour.

The OWL play area is owned and maintained by Chilham Parish Council. It was first created in 2004 and has been maintained to the standard required to address medium or high risk issues raised by annual inspection reports ever since. The parish council have established a ring fenced fund to maintain the play area and 50% of the cost will either be met from this ring fenced fund or other funding sources that can be accessed by the parish council.	
<b>BENEFIT TO THE LOCAL COMMUNITY:</b> (Please describe the improvements the scheme will deliver for the local community)	
The play area provides a vital community asset to children in the parish. It is located within a few yards of Old Wives Lees village hall and during term time is used every day by Little Owls Preschool or the Owlets Toddler Group during term time. The play area is in the centre of Old Wives Lees and is popular and regularly used by the children of the village. The issues raised by the annual inspection reports must be adequately addressed in order for the play area to be fit for purpose and serve the children of the parish.
