17	Shot...	POTHOLE REPAIRS, erosion of road edges in the country lanes getting worse due to increased use by larger vehicles (farm machinery, larger cars and delivery vans). HEDGEROW removal makes roads impossible in the snow season.

19	Shot...	Shottenden speed limit is designated at 60mph. It is a single track road with bends. Speed limit is far to high. Flooding on corner of Watery Lane and the top of Soles Hill Road Shottenden (On bad bend)
