Question raised from the public. Are the Parish Council aware that a 5 Day Notification NOT/2023/1289 to fell 22 trees that are described as being in poor condition in Woodland on Taylors Hill, has been lodged with Ashford Borough Council. Will the Parish Council be opposing the application.

Responding to the Question. The Parish Council are aware of the application. The application to fell the Tress is supported by Ashford Borough Council's Tree Officer. The owner of the land provided information on their plans for the site, including the report produced by Invicta Arboriculture on the state of the Trees requiring felling. The Chair asked Councillors to confirm whether they accepted the recommendation of the Tree Officer. **Decision: Councillors agreed to support the decision of the Tree Officer.** 

# 2023/094 Borough Councillors, Policing: Borough Councillor's Report – July 13<sup>th</sup> 2023

Since the last CPC meeting, I seem to have been particularly busy. I have attended several other Parish Council meetings, a couple of OWL Big Breakfasts (which I can thoroughly recommend), handled a large number of individual casework type problems, attended three ABC Councillor training sessions, have read

through an what seems to be an enormous number of reports and just this week have been to the ABC Ashford offices 5 times for assorted meetings.

Some more specific points to mention:

As I probably mentioned last time, but it needs reinforcing, there are increasing problems with overgrown trees and hedges. This is proving very challenging especially at this time of the year when growth is prolific. There are several places where overgrown hedges are bad such as along the paved side of the Selling Road. There are also places where the Council says that there is no problem when patently there is, e.g. opposite Dave Cauldron's garage on the Street in Chilham. In Old Wives Lees there are at least three street lamps that are hidden in high hedges or trees.

Noise is another perennial problem. Two particularly bad cases that I'm trying to address are (1) loud music being played on our own Latin Field and which is annoying several residents in both Green Lane and Selling Road, and (2) the almost continuing dog barking coming from the back garden of a house in Lower Lees (part of Cobbs Hill). I have been sent two recordings of this barking and it does indeed seem to be excessive. In fact, earlier this week I stood outside the front of the premises in question for about 15 minutes and the barking was indeed almost continuous. It was in my opinion totally unacceptable. The Council say that they have visited the premises but when they went there no dogs were to be found; my informant told me that, knowing the Council were doing an inspection, the dogs had been temporarily removed.

I still have no news on the gas converter due to be sited on the village green near the corner of Cobbs Hill and Cherry Orchard. A reminder has been sent to the Council on this. And also, I am still waiting to hear from the Council about a potential compulsory purchase of the dilapidated Peacock building on Chilham Square, i.e. a listed building which has been neglected for perhaps 25 years. There has been no noticeable advancement on the proposed solar farm at North Court Farm though we can assume that things have been going on behind the scenes. There are several major reasons why the solar farm "industry" nationally is almost on hold at present. In a similar vein, developments on the proposed artificial wetland on the Stour near the Chilham sewage processing plant are being slow to materialise, though this may be welcome by some

And finally, to the issue that has most concerned me during the past month. No doubt most of you will be aware that some tree felling has commenced in the woodland alongside the A252 road near to Taylors Hill car park. This was mentioned at the last CPC meeting. This felling was unauthorised – permission should have been obtained because there are two Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs) on the trees here. Incidentally, and to put the record straight, at our previous Parish Council meeting we were given entirely incorrect information about the TPOs. The ABC tree people acted fairly quickly to stop the felling but not before some damage had been done to the understorey. In order keep an eye on what is going on here I recently had a lengthy meeting with ABC's tree officer plus some correspondence with site's new owner. The situation presently is that the owner has a right to fell diseased, dead, or dangerous trees on this site having gained knowledge about these trees from both the ABC tree officer and a qualified licenced Arbo culturalist. Contrary to what has been stated elsewhere, I am well satisfied that both of these persons are acting with due discretion. They have identified and marked 22 additional trees that can be felled or where remedial action needs to take place. This action will occur in the very near future.

However, what I am not satisfied with are the owner's intentions for the future of this site. This site forms part of the Chilham Conservation area. Conservation means precisely what it "says on the tin." In this case it is the preservation of the existing desirable ambience. And conservation is not just about buildings – it can also refer to the existing natural environment. But, contrary to the conservation ethos, the new owner of the woodland has just this week said that he has engaged a garden designer to present plans for the development of the public area with footpaths, and a sculpture trail. But I have reason to believe that he has (or has had) intentions to go further than this. In my humble opinion almost all local small areas of what we might call "more natural nature" need to be conserved. Surely, we can all see that the planet is already being figuratively "trampled to death." Nature is being squeezed out and England is now the most de-natured country in Europe. Biodiversity is crashing at an accelerating rate. But thankfully many of us are fighting back and doing our best to re-install some of our natural environments. The saving of what is left of our more nature friendly environments must be continued in our Parish.

Finally, Can I suggest that our relevant committee seeks to establish the limitations of development in a rural conservation area such as Chilham? From what I have found to date it appears that the owner can, within small limitations, do pretty much as he pleases.

# A. Telephone dedicated for use by Clerk

At full CPC meeting on 15<sup>th</sup>June 2023 it was noted that telephone number for Clerk on website and Parish Magazine was out of date (minute 2023/084). This has been removed and it was agreed to provide mobile phone for Clerk's use.

When looking at options, possibility of a subscription to an on line service (Voice Over Internet Protocol – VOIP) was identified. This would allow call diversion to personal phone numbers which would be withheld.

<u>www.bOnline.com</u> has been identified as a suitable service, providing unlimited incoming call time for £6.00+VAT monthly (12 month subscription) - comparable with a basic mobile phone subscription.

Working Group supported this proposal (21Jun 23).
