TREE REMOVAL - MABEL'S WOOD AND THE BOTHY SITES

Regarding the tree removals at both these sites, I contacted Mark Chaplin, Placement Team Leader on Ashford Borough Council (ABC). He is the manager of Phil Cook, the Tree Officer, and as such has been kept up to date with both situations.

Mark agreed to a Teams Meeting with myself and Cllr Geoff Meaden, which took place on Tuesday.

After a long discussion it became apparent that we could not change what had happened, but Mark agreed that due to the intense interest of these sites, then ABC would be keeping a careful eye on both sites and would be in touch with both owners.

He also stated that many more trees would be replanted than were taken out.

I said there was scepticism that the trees would not be planted, and he assured us that he would expect planting to begin in February/March. I will be contacting him again on 1st March

2023/148 Questions from Residents

Email question from resident

My wife and I have lived in Bowerland Lane, Chilham since 1976. Our house is just off the A28, the only short section that remains with a 50mph, whereas other main Road sections around the village are just 40mpg.

Last night 9 November at approximately 19:25 there was a serious accident involving two cars, the occupants of both requiring to be cut from their vehicles. Accidents on this short stretch of the A28 are not uncommon, some including fatalities. Crossing it on foot and exiting Bowerland Lane is not at all easy as the vision in both directions requires moving onto the main road to see if it's clear. This probably contributed to last night's accident. There has been concerns about the junction at Bagham Barn. This area is 40mpg and vision at the junction is reasonable in all directions. Like all junctions it is a hazard. However, the short section of the A28 with 50mph limit is far more of a hazard with access onto it from Pickleden Lane, Bowerland Lane, Sunnybank Garage and various dwellings is far more hazardous due to it being 50mph limit, which is often far exceeded, especially by motorcyclists. We believe the Parish Council should push to have this short section reduced to 40mpg

Parish Councillors **Agreed** to the proposal to reduce the speed on the A28.

Question Are Councillors aware that Kent Highways permission is required for Gates with direct access to an A road. The question was raised regarding the land at the Bothy. Councillors will investigate.

Question raised regarding the repairs to the Highway outside the White Horse following the Gas leak in Chilham Square. Will the Council consider asking for the repairs to be returned to the original colour so that they blend in with the square.
